THE CRISIS IN MANIPUR AND IMPLICATIONS FOR HUMAN RIGHTS IN INDIA

Since May 2023, the state of Manipur in India has witnessed large-scale violence primarily against the tribal Christian Zo people (Kuki, Zomi, Hmar tribes) that led to at least 180 deaths, rampant sexual violence, and hundreds of churches and thousands of homes that were demolished or burned down. 70,000 people remain internally displaced.

In July 2023, in the state of Haryana, an anti-Muslim rally led to six people being killed followed by Muslim homes and businesses being targeted and destroyed in Nuh, a small city south of New Delhi.

As the 2024 elections in India draw close, our sideevent panel will discuss accountability for violence and how to prevent incitement and further violence against ethnic and religious minorities.
